## THE PRIDE CENTENARY JOURNEY OF LWIASE FROM 1922 TO 2023

Lady Willingdon Institute of Advanced Study in Education was established in 1922, by Government of India as an autonomous institution for teacher preparation named 'Lady Willingdon Training School' after 'Lady Willingdon' wife of Lord Willingdon, then Governor of Madras Presidency.

In 1922-24 the first batch of 23 women graduate teachers were presented to the Licentiate in teaching examination of the Madras University and they obtained the L.T. Degree. Initially the college offered two levels of teacher training programmes for women viz., Licentiate in Teaching for graduate and Secondary Grade Teacher Training for post-metric students and elementary Grade Teacher Training for those who completed the school course.

In 1941, the L.T. Degree was replaced by the B.T. Degree (Bachelor of Training) and in 1972-73, the B.T. Degree was replaced by B.Ed. Degree. From 1964-99 Tamil Pandit Course was functional. In 1972 M.Ed. course was started as Evening College course which was converted into regular course in 1981. In 1991 the Lady Willingdon College of Education was upgraded and renamed as 'Lady Willingdon Institute of Advanced Study in Education'.

The Master of Philosophy in Education both full time and part time courses were started from 1998-99. In 2000, LWIASE was the 'FIRST' Government Institution to be accredited at the level of FIVE STARS by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The institution celebrated its Golden Jubilee, Diamond Jubilee and Platinum Jubilee in the year 1972, 1983 and 1999 respectively.

The College was granted Autonomous status by the UGC on 5.07.2006. The college was accredited B++ level by NAAC in the year 31.03.2017. The College is affiliated to Tamilnadu Teachers Education University from 2008. Every year, 200 B.Ed Trainees, 25 M.Ed and many Ph.D students graduate with flying colours. This year 2023, LWIASE proudly celebrates centenary year success with significant strides in it centenary journey.

In order to achieve its mission the Institute has taken up substantial work in the areas of pre-service teacher education, research-based interventions, institutional planning, supporting development of textbooks, development of teacher manuals, CCE, IE, guidance and counselling, supporting the statewide orientation of in-service functionaries through various programmes and continue to innovate and attract the best talent from across the state and build this organisation from strength to strength and remain committed to excellence.
